Post 2nd year or 24 months of residency + Step 3 — applying for first time licensure

Why?

- Job preparation, locums, disability exams

-If you want your license upon completing residency, complete application by January of 3rd year

Steps:

- Find a buddy and check-in with each other about your progress every couple months
- Budget (see below, but around \$1000-2000, which may get reimbursed by CME or next employer)
- Review timing/logistics
- Work on your CV
 - **1. State Medical License** (multiple or just NM, see below)
 - 2. Controlled Substance Registration (CSR)
 - 3. DEA License
 - 4. Buprenorphine Waiver/ "X" number

Medical State License

- Timing: Need to renew every 3 years
 - 1-2 hours to fill out application
 - o 2-4 weeks for transcripts, exam scores, & letters of rec
 - 60-90 days to get license after application completed & docs sent in

Cost:

~Free NM application process for first time (not \$400)

But there are additional costs...

- (\$45.25 for NM) Criminal Background check
- \$70 USMLE transcripts: FSMB transcript request
- ≥\$70 university transcripts, pending # of programs (\$70 for 1-2 transcripts, \$140 for 3-4, \$210 for 5-6...)
- \$350 if through Hospital Services Corp (HSC)* newly required for NM
- \$395 if through Federation Credentials Verification Service (FCVS)

Consider GME, CME, or next employer reimbursement or grants to help offset costs

Check list:

- USMLE IDs & contact info for med school & post-grad program
- Recent passport-like photo taken in last 6mo
- Criminal Background check
- Envelopes, stamps
- Updated CV
- 2 physicians to fill out letters of rec form (some forms say 3, but recently confirmed only 2 needed)
- Use a non "salud"/UNM email (you will lose access after residency and subsequently, all correspondence regarding your application)

^{*}When in doubt, just call/email the organizations

^{*}Keep records of what you requested, sent, and status of apps

Multiple state licenses: apply through Federation of State Medical Boards

Uniform Application - eliminates need for applicants to re-enter information when applying for licenses in multiple states

- -Some states require UA and some do not accept UA: <u>UA Participating Boards</u> \$60
- -Once you make username and password, you can pick a state and then will be directed to the state's medical board site for application
- *Make sure you read about details for name issues (must submit a certified copy of a legal name change documents)

<u>Practitioner Direct</u> - electronic application submission, eliminates need for you to process, receive & manually mail to board FREE

- -Creates a National Practitioner Data Bank (NPDB) report for you
- -Some state medical boards may not be eligible to receive an NPDB Direct report and some may require you to submit a Physician Data Center (PDC) Profile electronically
 - *PDC does not have USMLE scores
 - *Does not work if states require FCVS-see next

Federation Credentials Verification Service Application - easy way to store credentials and use for multiple states forever

- -Must fill out **before** the UA <u>Tips for Applying</u> \$395
- *NOT the same as an application for state licensure
- *Need a notary for two forms (Affidavit & Release Form and Certification of Identification Form) before you can submit
- -Some states require (i.e. Utah, Wyoming) FSMB | Contact a State Medical Board

\$350 HSC Source Documents- how to

- Fill out the application online <u>HSC Portal/App</u>
 - O HSC application form- hard copy- *Download and/or print has a nice checklist
 - Need to list 5 professional peer references with the same or higher level of licensure
- Pay \$350 electronically to HSC or see "how to" doc to mail in
- Get Criminal background Gemalto online registration
 - More instructions <u>review page 6 only</u>
- Send the following to NMHSC
 - HSC Credentials Verification Service (located on "HSC Source documents")
- Send the following to NM Medical Board
 - Sign and send in the <u>Authorization of release</u> to NMMB (mail or email)
 - "Applicants Oath" & passport photo +/- immigration papers (can send to HCS or medical board)
- Obtain Exams scores: Ask USMLE, Flex, SPEX to send in your scores electronically, most often need to use FSMB transcript request
- May have to get other documents (HSC will alert you if necessary)
- Answers to common questions from Dr. Nava-Marquez- MM License Application Qs.pdf

Notes: Call state medical board or service you chose with any questions and keep a copy of your application

- o Call state medical board 1 month after application completed to check status
- No Interview is required
- o If international medical grad, request ECFMG Certification to be sent directly
- o If you have ever been arrested, do mark "yes" & explain (you have to provide fingerprint records after all)
- Locum Tenens available if license pending; but you will not have DEA #

*Need license # to apply for CSR, then can apply for DEA #

CSR (Controlled Substance Registration) for NM: must obtain before DEA

- Timing: renew the following year, may be earlier than 1 year in some cases
 - 5-10 business days processing time once completed application received
- Cost:
 - Up to \$75 but depends on fee schedule
 - UNM as future employer will not reimburse, others may
- Check list:
 - copy of NM Medical License
 - o check or credit card info, envelope, stamps
- Application process: <u>NM Board of Pharmacy</u>
 - Paper form/instructions
 - Mark all scheduled drugs including 2, 2N, 3, 3N, 4, 5
 - Send in w/ payment (read Fee Schedule for New Registrants very carefully)
 - Or can try app online- <u>Create profile</u>, <u>apply for NEW license</u>
 - O Call NM Board of Pharmacy with questions

DEA

- Timing: Renewal is every 3 years
 - 4-6wks processing time
- Cost:
 - o \$888
 - UNM has not covered previously, but some employers will, Locum Tenens reimburses after 100hrs in calendar year
- Check list:
 - State Medical License
 - o CSR needed first
- Application process: <u>DEA Registration Tools</u>
 - o Complete Form 224 as a New Applicant
 - Use employer for address
 - A separate registration is required for each primary place you DISPENSE (if just separate locations WITHIN the state, separate licenses are not required)
 - o If you apply for a fee exempt license through UNM, then you are restricted to provide coverage through UNM

- You don't need an "X" number anymore!
- Check list:

 - Search email now for buprenorphine training certificate & save a pdf copy to your files
- SAMHSA DATA Waiver
